	To be used for food, feed, processing and to be placed on the market			
This approval is granted subject to the following conditions-				

- 1. The maize should be transported in a sealed container
- 2. The transporter should use the nearest border with the shortest route to the mill
- 3. Premier Swaziland and Transporter (Operators) should take full responsibility for the load in transit, and should be aware of the Emergency Response Measures of GMO consignments
- 4. Premier should mill the maize before selling or distribution to consumers
- 5. Every consignment should be accompanied by an import permit
- 6. Premier should ensure that the food/feed products are clearly labelled "CONTAINS GENETICALLY MODIFIED ORGANISMS" as per the dictates of the Biosafety Act, 2012 and its Draft Biosafety Regulations
- 7. The Operators (Importer & Supplier) should only import the approved events

7.0 The applicant should meet the following requirements for conveyor shipment

The dictates Article 7 of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety on the Advance Informed Agreement procedure, by also acquiring an Export Permit form the Competent Authority of the Exporting Country
